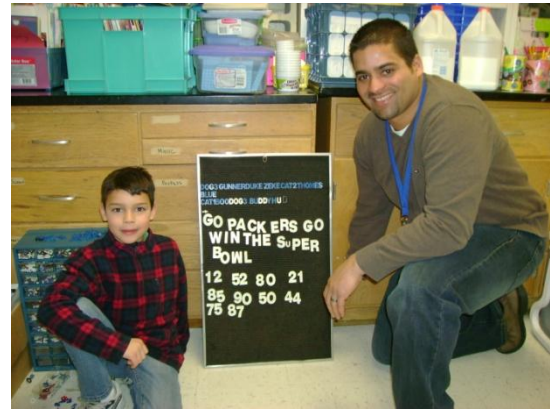
“Kindergarten Corner”
